

From the Desk of Pastor Mark

Acts 4: 1-4

"And as they were speaking to the people, the priests and the captain of the temple and the Sadducees came upon them, greatly annoyed because they were teaching the people and proclaiming in Jesus the resurrection from the dead. And they arrested them and put them in custody until the next day, for it was already evening. But many of those who had heard the word believed, and the number of men came to be about five thousand."

The beginning of Acts 4 testifies to the Apostles Peter and John preaching and teaching the word publicly, boldly. They were testifying to Jesus Christ crucified and risen from death to life! There was nothing, even arrest that was going to stop them from proclaiming this truth, from sharing it with the world. This is why we are worshipping Jesus in 2024 in churches in Barret, Hoffman, and Elbow Lake! It was because of this bold preaching and testifying of the Apostles.

The preaching and testifying to the Good News of/about Jesus of Nazareth, is vital to the world. The salvation of Jesus is transformative. We, the church, are called to this work every day of our lives. It doesn't take much to invite a person we meet to come worship with us at Peace, Messiah, or United. In a real sense, we are simply (but powerfully) inviting a person to "come and see", like Jesus invited Peter and Andrew to do one day when he "saw" them.

What (who?) do we "see"? It is divine love that invites another human being to come and see Jesus, with us through worship and hearing God's life giving Word. I think the challenge is we don't think we can be bold enough to invite, but its simply that—an invitation. It's the number one reason a person ends up in a church worshipping the God of Jesus the Christ. It's number one. It isn't even close to any other method of outreach. Invite! Share the Good News! Testify to it in the way of word and deed! Let's do it!

Treasurer's report was reviewed/discussed with Heidi pointing that giving was down, motion to approve by Dan, second Janet, M.C.

The books from our library will be boxed and delivered to the Elbow Lake Public Library. The Sunday School/Education committee is continuing to search for volunteers. 



We plan to display our quilts on Sunday, May 19th and then give them to the graduates on Sunday, May 26th during their recognition ceremony. We did not have enough items to send boxes to Lutheran World Relief or Global Missions this spring. We will continue to build on our kits for the Fall shipment. We are thankful to our Thrivent members who apply for Thrivent Credit Cards that can be used for quilting supplies, Mission Kit items or groceries towards the Farmers Market meal. Each card needs a specific cause for use.

The "Mission of the Month" for May is items for Hospice Kits. The items that are needed are: 1 regular size bath towel new or gently used and 48 to 52 inches in length, 1 washcloth, 1 bath size bar of Ivory or Dove soap in original wrapping, 1 new toothbrush in original individual packaging, 1 new "pick" style comb, 1 new nail clipper, 6 band aids, 1 jar of petroleum jelly (4 oz. size or more) 1 pair of heavy duty household gloves, (kitchen type) size medium, Pack items in the towel and label what the kit is for. You can drop them off in the basket provided in the Narthex. Items for any of the mission kits may be dropped off any time. Kit items are listed in your WELCA book. Please mark what kit you are donating to when you drop them off. We can also use used but good light weight bath and hand towels for most of our kits.
